


Figure A.1 All intrastate conflicts, conflicts in Muslim countries and conflicts with Islamist insurgents, 1946–2013






Figure A.3 Armed conflicts and religion by country, 1989-2008




Figure A.4 Intra-state armed conflicts with Islamist insurgents, 1975-2013




Figure A.6 Civil wars with Islamist insurgents as a share of all civil wars, 1946–2013





Figure A.7 Share of battle deaths in civil wars in Muslim countries, three year averages, 1946–2013

We have omitted this war from the list of wars involving Muslim countries. No Muslim countries participated in the Vietnam War.

Among the ten countries with the largest Muslim population, only three had an on-going civil war in 2013. None of the remaining seven had experienced a civil war in the last ten years, although three had smaller internal armed conflicts. The three countries with civil wars account for a total of 18% of the world's estimated Muslim population in 2009, while the seven others account for 49% of all Muslims.
